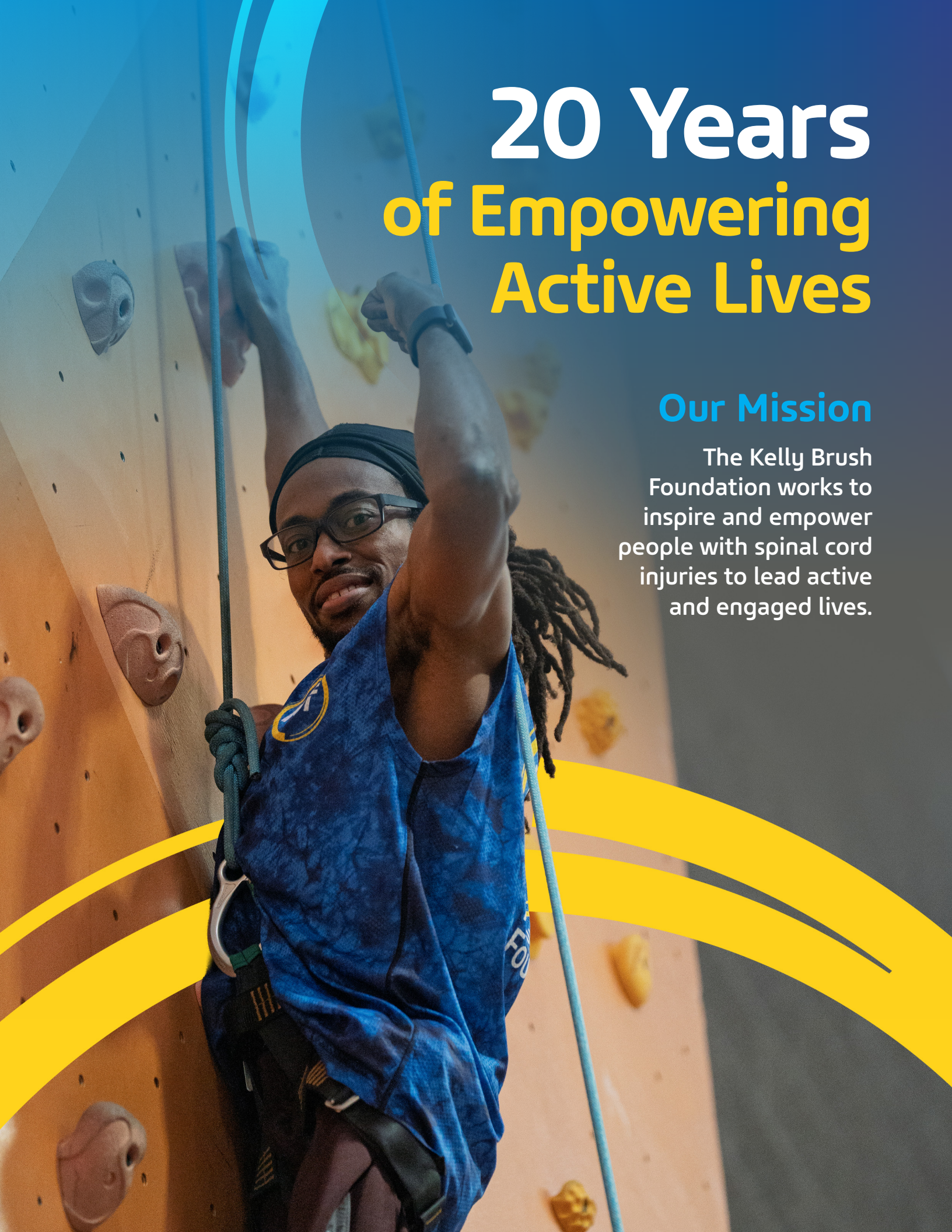

Our Mission

The Kelly Brush Foundation works to inspire and empower people with spinal cord injuries to lead active and engaged lives.

Our Origin

From the very beginning, Kelly has identified as an athlete. Growing up in Charlotte, Vermont, she competed in every sport she could, ultimately focusing on alpine ski racing at Green Mountain Valley School. Known from a young age for her fearless, “tiger-like” racing style, Kelly rose through the national rankings and qualified for the U.S. National Championships in high school. Following in the footsteps of her parents and older sister as an NCAA athlete on the Middleburg College Ski Team was her dream, and she was thrilled to join the Panthers as a member of the class of 2008. Kelly quickly became a key contributor to the team, earning top finishes during her sophomore season and emerging as a dependable, rising competitor.

That momentum was abruptly interrupted on February 18, 2006, when Kelly sustained a life-altering spinal cord injury during a collegiate race. After extensive surgery and months of rehabilitation, she returned to Middlebury determined to move forward with the same grit that had defined her athletic career. Early in her recovery, inspired by the support from the community that rallied around her, Kelly and her family founded the Kelly Brush Foundation, with an early mission to improve Alpine Ski Racing Safety standards and help people with SCIs to access adaptive sports. Kelly rejoined the ski team, learned to ski in a monoski, and made a triumphant return to the course as a forerunner at the Middlebury Carnival. She graduated on time in 2008, received the NCAA Inspiration Award, and went on to become a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner, all while transforming the Kelly Brush Foundation from a grassroots organization into a national non-profit serving thousands. Today, Kelly continues to live an active, full life as an athlete, professional, and mother, embodying the resilience, possibility, and mindset the Foundation strives to inspire in others living with paralysis.

Letter from Kelly

September 2025 kicked off the year-long celebration of the 20th anniversary of the Kelly Brush Foundation, and I could not be prouder or more excited about where we are as an organization. Starting with the 20th Kelly Brush Ride in September (which was rainy for the first time in 18 years but had some of the best energy I can remember), we are not only looking back on where we came from and all we've accomplished, but we're also looking ahead to what we want to accomplish in the next 20 years.

In the next 20 years, we want to empower more people with adaptive sports equipment grants, connect the disability community in an even greater way, and transform our recreational spaces so people with disabilities are completely intertwined with all recreation. We also want to double down on our work in ski racing safety by creating a deeper partnership with US Ski and Snowboard, taking our mission internationally by working with the International Ski Federation (FIS), and continuing to advocate for best safety practices at every level of the sport in our backyard and across the globe.

When I reflect on the last 20 years, I'm proudest of the impact we've made and the lives we changed. If the KBF never existed, there would be thousands of people with spinal cord injuries who would be much less active and fulfilled, and ski racing may still be operating from a hope-and-pray standpoint with safety. The KBF and I are making the change we want to see in the world, and for this, I am eternally grateful.

Has the ability to obtain a piece of recreational equipment.



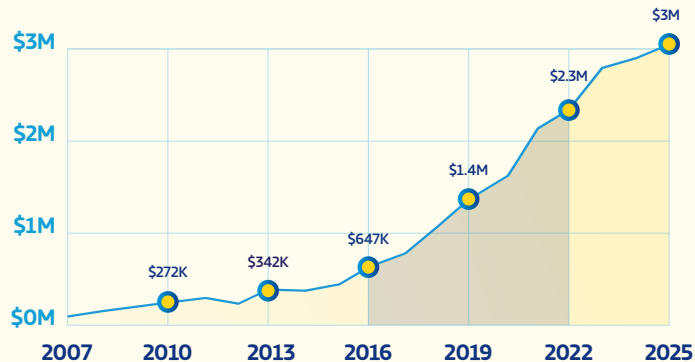
Has the knowledge and community it takes to recreate.

Turns & Berms

May 8 -12 | Bend, Oregon

The 4th annual Turns & Berms Camp brought together 20 adaptive athletes in Bend, Oregon, for a long weekend of skiing, mountain biking, and community. Hosted in collaboration between the Kelly Brush Foundation and Oregon Adaptive Sports, the camp combined spring skiing at Mt. Bachelor with adaptive mountain biking in the Deschutes National Forest. Over several days, athletes challenged themselves on snow and dirt while building strong connections through shared experiences, laughter, and mutual support, making the camp a powerful celebration of movement, resilience, and community.



Shepherd Summer Trip to ASC

August 10-14 | Crested Butte, Colorado

In partnership with Shepherd Hospital, this five-day adaptive adventure trip to the Adaptive Sports Center in Crested Butte, Colorado, brought together five athletes who previously completed inpatient rehabilitation at Shepherd Center, each accompanied by a loved one. Traveling from across the Southeast, participants experienced a wide range of outdoor activities, including paddling at Lake Irwin and adaptive mountain biking on local trails and downhill terrain. With one-on-one instruction, accessible lodging, and full staff support, athletes built confidence, independence, and community while rediscovering the joy of sport and outdoor adventure in a supportive, mountain setting.

TRAC Camp

August 3-9 | Park City, Utah

In collaboration with Craig Hospital, this year's TRAC (Teen Rehabilitation at Craig) Camp was held at the National Ability Center in Park City, Utah. Seven young men, each joined by a chosen peer, spent a week exploring adaptive recreation through activities such as archery, adaptive mountain biking, and rafting in the canyons of Moab. Designed specifically for teens, the camp fostered connection, independence, and confidence by creating a space where participants could build community, experience new adventures, and envision an active, engaged future.



Wheelchair Sports Camp

November 8-12 | Phoenix, Arizona

The first-ever KBF Wheelchair Sports Camp was held at Ability360 in Phoenix, Arizona, and brought together eight athletes for a three-day introduction to adaptive sports. Designed for beginners, the camp provided an intro to multiple wheelchair sports, including tennis, pickleball, softball, basketball, and optional activities like swimming and rock climbing. Athletes traveled from across the country to learn new skills, connect with peers, and build confidence in a supportive, community-focused environment on one of the nation's premier adaptive sports campuses.

Breaking Barriers to the Outdoors

For many people, recreation provides an essential escape from the stresses of everyday life. While many can simply lace up a pair of sneakers and head outside for a run through town or a walk in the woods, that same access to recreation can require thousands of dollars in specialized equipment for individuals with disabilities. Not only have equipment costs increased over time, but more expensive equipment has become more popular. Since 2018, mountain biking has surged in popularity and is now one of our most requested equipment types. When off-road handcycles first gained traction, we awarded just 11 grants. Within three years, that number doubled, and today we average 50 adaptive mountain bike grants each year.

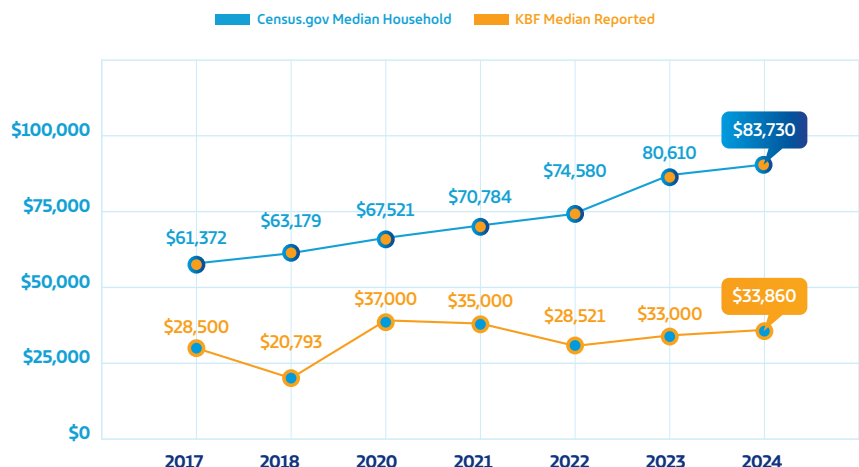

And it's not just the equipment. For individuals with spinal cord injuries, the cost of getting active comes with numerous financial barriers, from transportation and training to ongoing maintenance and support.

These challenges are compounded by the fact that the median household income of our grant recipients is less than half that of the average American family, leaving many individuals with limited discretionary income to cover the additional costs associated with adaptive recreation. As a result, opportunities to stay active, healthy, and connected to their communities often remain financially out of reach without support.

We are on a mission to make recreation accessible for all. In 2025, we assessed more than **50 miles** of mountain bike trails to identify opportunities for improvement, bringing our total to **188 miles** of trails assessed statewide.

Each year, we invest **\$20,000** in trail networks across Vermont to support accessibility-focused trail modifications. Through our partnerships with Vermont Mountain Bike Association (VMBA) and Vermont Adaptive Ski & Sports, we've built a truly unique collaboration, one that is setting a national example and making waves well beyond Vermont.

We're also raising awareness through community screenings of the documentary **Best Day Ever**, which follows **KBF Chief Program Ambassador Greg Durso** and community member **Allie Bianchi** as they navigate the daily realities of disability while finding joy, connection, and belonging within Vermont's mountain biking community.

Following several tragic accidents over the past year, the KBF called on International Ski Federation (FIS) leadership to strengthen safety practices and standards at race courses and training arenas across the globe. This has led to regular and productive conversations and planning together with FIS and U.S. Ski & Snowboard to enhance safety standards and better protect racers on course, both in the U.S. and internationally.

Thanks to the KBF's work over the last 20 years, the US is a leader in alpine racing safety, and we are committed to expanding that impact worldwide. Since 2019, the **KBF has distributed over 5,000 Stop the Bleed kits** to coaches, race officials, parents, and programs, ensuring life-saving supplies are nearby in the event of a laceration.

We continue to double down on education and advocacy in the U.S. to protect racers at every level. **This year, KBF awarded \$90,745 to 22 alpine clubs to purchase critical safety equipment, helping keep over 10,000 racers safer in training and competition.**
